## Animate Intransitive Verbs (VAI)

waniskâw — (s)he/they rises from bed (wakes up)

wawêyîw — (s)he/they gets ready/dressed

postayiwinisêw — (s)he/they puts on clothing

postasâkêw — (s)he/they puts on a garment (jacket, dress, skirt, shirt)

postitâsêw — (s)he/they puts on pants

postasikanêw — (s)he/they puts on socks

mêtawêw — (s)he/they plays

kistâpitêhow — (s)he/they brushes their teeth

kâsîhkwêw — (s)he/they washes their face

kâsîhncêw — (s)he/they washes their hands

sîkâhow — (s)he/they combs their hair

apiw — (s)he/they sits

mîcisow — (s)he/they eats

itohtêw — (s)he/they goes (physically changes location)

wayawîw — (s)he/they goes outside

kwayâhow — (s)he/they hurries
